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SBTA General Election 2024

SBTA's General Election will be held from February 22 through March 7, 2024. The following duties are for twelve (12) SBTA Board of Director's seats, State Council seats (number to be determined by CTA), and NEA-RA delegate seats (number to be determined by NEA). These positions are open to all members of SBTA, CTA, and NEA.

SBTA EXECUTIVE BOARD POSITIONS

Elementary School (6), Middle School (2), High School (3), and Special Services (1) Positions: (majority vote required)

- Attend all Rep Council and Board Meetings
 Work with SBTA Committee(s)
- · Liaison to elected Reps and their Schools
- · Be responsible for the work and progress of the association
- Attend Association Conferences
- Review and recommend the annual budget to the Rep Council
- Act as Rep Council when the majority of schools are not in session
- Term expires June 30, 2026

NEA Local Delegate: For the year of 2024

Delegates will attend the NEA yearly meeting in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania which is held July 3, 2024 through July 7, 2024. SBTA funds delegates for up to \$2,000.00 in expenses. Delegates are expected to attend all California State Meetings, as well as the NEA General Assembly meetings. This NEA Meeting sets policy for NEA for the year 2024. Term is for one year. Positions determined by plurality.

CTA State Council Position Seats 1, 2, and 3: Term expires June 2027

Three (3) positions and two (2) alternates. State Council delegates attend four CTA State Council Meetings per year. The meetings begin on Friday night and end Sunday afternoon. Delegates also attend San Gorgonio Service Center Council meetings held four Saturdays per year. All expenses are reimbursed by CTA. Majority vote required.

Every effort has been made to insure the accuracy of each of the candidate statements, and are placed according to the CTA alphabetical order for 2023-2024. Some formatting was necessary due to the dimension and aspect ratio of the allotted space. The spellings of candidate names are transcribed from the Declaration of Candidacy forms. Font selections on printed submissions were matched as closely as possible, or assigned in the case of handwritten submissions. Statements in excess of 100 words, as per the Declaration of Candidacy, are limited to first hundred words only and are notated as such. Word count was made through utilizing the Microsoft Word Counting tool, and rechecked by the Elections Committee Chairperson. A set of three periods (...) at the end of the candidate's statement indicate truncation. Final photo quality is dependent upon the quality of the submitted photo; printed, copied, of emailed as a .jpg or .pdf file.




